Contesting should not provide a fear to the radio operator. No one is going to criticize the results from your participation in a contest. The only criticism will come from yourself.


QST magazine provides a current monthly list of several contests available to the radio amateur. Our April meeting will provide suggestions and explanations on the skill of "contesting".

New FCC Public Notice

Doing business with the FCC just got still harder.

"... All applicants and licensees are required to access CORES to pay any application or regulatory fees, manage or reset a password on an existing FRN, or request a new FRN. When accessing the system, users will be prompted to request a sixdigit secondary verification code, which will be sent to the email address(es) associated with each username. The user will then need to enter the code into CORES before they can continue. ..."

<u>The next meeting</u> of Ocean County ARES will be April 17, 2024 at the Ocean County EOC, Robert J Miller Airport, Berkeley Township. This is an in-person meeting and NOT Zoom. The meeting start time is 7:00 PM. All are welcome.

On February 23, 2024, K2IYE became a Silent Key. Frank was a longstanding Ocean County ARES board member. Since Ocean County ARES is a New Jersey incorporated non-profit, our charter requires a certain amount of ARRL members on the board. At the March 12, 2024 board meeting, Mike – K2MDW, was voted in to replace K2IYE. I would like to congratulate Mike on accepting this position. He now joins WX2NJ, N2XW and W2PTZ on the ARES board.

Currently, the Ocean County ARES roster of members has 60 operators listed. Many have not been heard from in months, if not years. Over the next several weeks, I will be making every effort to contact each operator via email and/or USPS to verify if they want to remain active. Recently, our nets and activities have been represented by approximately 10 to 12 operators and this is not enough manpower to manage an emergency or disaster.

If you are on the groups.io mailing list, you are most likely on the roster and are in receipt of this newsletter. If you no longer wish to be active, please let me know by email. The address is my callsign at comcast.net

Ocean County ARES has also recently signed up with the ARRL national ARES database. This is a central database through the ARRL in which interested operators can be directed to the appropriate ARES organization and not rely on just word of mouth. Hopefully, this new system will bring more operators to our organization who have a true interest is serving. From the SNJ SEC, WB2ALJ:

ARES EC-001 & EC-016 Versions

ARRL staff has indicated that the current online versions of EC-001 and EC-016 are ending on March 31, 2024. If you are currently enrolled in either, it was indicated that you should complete the course by March 31st, 2024.

Updates for the ARES course will be offered starting with the "Basic" course on April 1st, 2024. An "Intermediate" course scheduled to be offered soon. The ARES "Leadership" course to replace EC-016 is underdeveloped.

The ARES "Task-Book" is also being updated while changes are expected to be minor according to ARRL ARES staff. No current date for release was provided.

The "Bike MS: Coast the Coast 2024" ride fundraiser is seeking amateur radio operators for May 11, 2024. How I Got Into Ham Radio

Such names as Heathkit were made known to me from an early age. The sound of Morse Code made way into my ears from before I can remember. Those sounds, or the booming FM signal of a ham in DE land, were my earliest introduction to the world of Ham Radio. It was not until I earned my license, however, that I truly understood the magic of Ham Radio and the world that answers your CQ. It is an evolving hobby, of course, opened up to me.

My Pop, K2QDY, and my Dad, KB2FWP, brought me into the world of Ham Radio. Field Day's of years past form many parts of my early memories. Hot, humid weather, sticky watermelon juice, and the sound of generators humming in the background are all a part of As for me, what I envision at my new home is a big, that story. Fond memories of wire antennas being constructed in a park remain with me.

What it all meant only became clear to me when the FCC gave me the call sign I still have today: KC2IGE. My Dad was beaming with pride when the examiners handed me my first CSCE and I will never forget when I made it past the General License and earned the Amateur Extra license.

You never forget your first QSO. Mine was with my Pop on 80M CW. He sent me a QSL the next day, and it remains the first QSL in my binder. That binder expanded over the years. At first, European contacts made their way into the plastic card protectors. Over time, and with improved solar conditions, faraway Pacific Islands came into reach. The African nations came through on 20 Meters and the QSLs with elephants emblazoned thereon arrived in the mail. I'll never forget speaking with an American soldier who told me he was on the back of a tank in the Iragi desert. Often, I wondered what my postal carrier thought with the volume of foreign mail that made its way into my mailbox.

Over time, I became intrigued by the prospect of building my own radio. I started with a simple 20meter CW transceiver. It worked, not necessarily well, but it was my own. As I was able to save money, I took the leap and bought the Elecraft K1 transceiver. 20 and 15 meter RF boards were my first, quickly followed by 40 and 80 meter boards.

That K1 has traveled with me to campsites and still

serves me well. My proudest moment was breaking through the European wall with its 5 watts and working the DXpedition to Heard Island, VKOEK. Truly, a magical moment to hear my call come back to me on a radio I built.

Ham Radio is about community. I never met the majority of Hams I've QSOed with. But we all know of someone - whether distant or close - who reliable but I think it important to not lose the personal touch that CW or SSB brings. Sure, digital modes like FT8 exist and they do work, but is it really in the spirit of our hobby to simply click a button and let the computer do the rest?

How To Update Your FCC Username

FCC CORES new username account instructions:

If you haven't already created a new CORES account, you must register a *username* (use your main email address!) and a username password (just make up one, but be sure to save it for the next time).

Visit the **CORES** website <u>https://apps.fcc.gov/cores/</u> to set up the account.

When logged into the new account, choose the first option, "Associate Username to FRN."

Enter your FRN & Comment – Comment Example: "Associating FRN." If you do not know your FRN, look on your license, or you can find it by searching your call sign on the FCC License Search page.

Click "Continue"

If you know your *password to your FRN*, enter it now. This password will more than likely be different from the one you have with your username account. If you

do not know your **FRN password**, choose the "Forgot FRN Password" option underneath the "Submit" button.

You should now have at least 3 passwords: one for your FCC username, one for your FRN, and one of course to send and receive e-mail via your e-mail service.

Check the information. You may need to update addresses, phone numbers, etc.

Once you have completed these steps and your FRN has been associated to your username, you should be brought back to the main menu. It may take a few minutes.

Log out.

How To Renew 0r Update Your License

First, you may need to **update your FCC Username** account, as the FCC CORES system was changed in 2016 and the previous version CORES system was discontinued in 2022. See instructions in the <u>"How To</u> <u>Update Your FCC Username"</u> article above.

File your renewal application using the **FCC ULS License Manager** System and pay the \$35 application fee. That can be done by email using a charge card.

You should receive the **Official Copy** of your new or updated license by email from the FCC in a few days. Be prepared to print at least one hard copy. It will be 2 pages: the front and the back.
