2024 Field Day

On Saturday June 22nd the Holiday City Amateur Radio Club participated in the annual ARRL field day exercise. About 22 members and wives arrived at the Christ Episcopal Church on Washington Street at about 10:00 AM. The rear of the church property has a large grassed area with a large pavilion.

The group began to erect five fiber glass and aluminum 28 foot polls that would hold up two G5RV antennas. The poles were supported by four Dacron ropes each and a pulley to support the antenna insulators. It took the group almost three hours to install the poles and antennas.

The heat that day was unbearable and reached almost 100 degrees. At lunch time the group took a break and dined on pizza pies and plenty of water.

After lunch the four transmitters were tested to make sure they functioned properly. The G5RV antennas were fed with ladder line. One transmitter had an external tuner that allowed that operator to operate on any of the three bands we were going to use. 40, 20 and 15 meters. The other transmitter had a Balun transformer connected to the open wire and then to a tuner which allowed that operator to work any of the three bands. A third transmitter was connected by coax transmission line to a multi band vertical. The fourth transmitter had a vertical on top of a car and he operated FT8.

At 2:00 PM the operating began. One group was on CW operating on 20 meters. They worked 23 states with Arizona and Colorado being the furthest west.

Another group was on 40 meters SSB and worked 13 states and Ontario Canada.

In this group one of the operators was Vickie Pennell. Vickie does not have a license but she made many contacts with this group.

The third group used a vertical on 40 meters. The fourth group worked FT8 with only 10 watts using a vertical mounted on the roof of a car and made contacts in New Hampshire, Ohio and Eastern Massachusetts.


