

Start each character at the "Home" mark. For a dit, move to the right one character; for a dah, move down one character. For example, the letter C is "dah di-dah dit", and the question mark is "di-di-dah dah di-dit".

The dots and dashes in chart represent non-English characters.

## It's About Time

The duration of one second is internationally defined as 9,192,631,770 cycles of the resonant frequency of Cesium 133, which is therefore exactly 9192. 631,770 MHz. (That's a wavelength of roughly 32.6mm.)

That therefore sets the primary standard for frequencies and time durations.

The speed of light is internationally defined as exactly 299,792,458 metres per second.

So, the international prime standard metre (meter) equals exactly 9,192,631,770 cycles divided by exactly

299,792,458 wavelengths of the resonant frequency of cesium 133.

That's about 30.66332 wavelengths of about 32.6mm each.

The metre, as so defined, is the standard for all lengths, including inch (25.4mm). So it's about

39.37007874015748031496062992126 inches.

A year is astrologically equal to about 365.243 days. That's why we have a leap year every four years, except that the first year of a century is not a leap year unless its year number is an even multiple of 400.

When the astrological length of a year differs from the calendar year by more than a half second, we need a Leap Second for the correction.

#### Where Am I?

Your "QTH" can mean your mailing address or your Latitude & Longitude, or some combination of the following.

For contest credit, the station you contact may want to know where your station is located.

Assuming you're in Ocean County, NJ, the answer is:

IARU Region = 2 (The Americas)

ITU Zone= 08 (Eastern continental US, for most DX contests)

CQ Zone= 05 (Eastern continental US, for CQWW contests)

FCC Callsign district= 2 (NY & NJ)

ARRL Division = Atlantic

ARRL Section = SNJ (For Field Day, etc.)

New Jersey County= OCEAN (for WANJ Contest)

"Grid Square", or "Grid Code", or sometimes "LOC" in CW, usually refers to the Maidenhead Co-ordinate System code (needed for many other contests):

To find your own station's grid code, enter your callsign at QRZ.com. Click "Detail".

Then, below the map, click "Explore".

If your location is on that map, your grid code is the 6 characters such as "FM29vw".

If your location is not on the map displayed, QRZ.com could not find the exact address given, so the grid code given is incorrect, and you may need to correct an error in the FCC's database.

Our local "Whispering Pines Park" is within Maidenhead grid zone FM29vw ("Foxtrot Mike Two Niner Victor Whiskey")


