# The President's Corner By Dave WA2DJN

There were 12 members who attended the September meeting. We had one guest Lenard Bicher, N2LFJ, who lives in Bayville N.J. and is an extra class amateur.

Norm Smith gave the secretary's report, however, Joe Militano was not present so I told the members that we had purchased the Liability Insurance which comes due in November 2010 and we are covered till November of 2011.

We discussed the nominations of new officers, but no members volunteered for any positions. We will discuss what to do at the next board meeting on September 29<sup>th</sup>. We need members to take over the club officers for next year.

We talked about having code practice sessions and several members said that they were interested in learning the code. Larry and Steve will work on a code practice class.

Larry Puccio gave a talk about DX QSL cards and how they are routed through the ARRL and then onto the NJDXA association for distribution to the 2<sup>nd</sup> call area. There are ten call areas within the US.

There are 14 primary sorters and 26 letter managers, A-Z, who get bags of cards, which they sort from calls AA2aaa through WD2zzz. Sorting takes 4-5 hours. Larry uses index cards for each subscriber, who sends in \$12.00 for 20 credits toward the mailing. There are 5-7 envelopes, 6-9 envelopes, and large Flat Rate Parcel Post envelopes which have to be stuffed and weighted for postage in order to be sent to each of the subscribers. He makes a spread sheet and card files and spends many hours sending out the DX QSL cards to the subscribers.

The subscribers send in money to the NJDXA association by check or pay pal to cover the cost of the mailing. At the end of the year all the remaining cards must be sent out and the files are purged. There is also a monthly expense report which is to sent to the

NJDXA, so that he can get back the funds which he has to lay out during the month. He puts in a lot of time to send out the QSL cards. If you are interested in sending out OSL cards via the bureau the address is: NJDXA P.O. Box 599 Morris Plains N.J. 7950.

Larry gave a great talk about how DX QSL cards come to the bureau and are sorted and sent to various subscribers. It is a very hard job. Thank you for all your

# Ham Cram and General Theory By Urb LeJeune W2DEC

The Old Barney ARC (OBARC) is going to do another "'Ham Cram" and also a multi-week "General Class" upgrade program that will be delivered at Southern Regional High School (http://www.srsd.net).

The "Ham Cram" is a one day intensive study of test material from the Technician Grade License manual. All the questions are reviewed and the correct answers provided. Following the review the Technician Grade VE exam will be administered.

The memorization of the questions for any grade license does not provide the candidate with a background in the theory behind the questions. Our seven week General Class license material is an ARRL prepared class designed to provide the student with a firm background in the theory required for the General Class Test.

The General class will begin on Wednesday October 6<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 - 9:00 PM in Room 5-0 and will run for about 7 weeks. The Adult School charges a tuition fee of \$20 per student. We suggest that students purchase a copy of the ARRL General Class License manual.

The Technician Grade Ham Cram takes place on Saturday October 9th at the Ocean Acres Community Center. Directions can be found on the OBARC web site (http://www.obarc.org).

# Internet Shortcuts for your Windows Desktop By Murray Goldberg KD2IN

For some time now I have been using shortcuts to Internet sites located on the Desktop screen of my computer. Perhaps other computer users have known of how to do this already, but I kind of stumbled onto this a while ago on my own. Of what value is this?

Well normally you have to bring up the Web Browser to go to a particular web site. Then you either type in an address, or open you favorites list and select one, double-click on it, and then the site will open. By placing the web shortcut on the Desktop with one double-click on it I go directly to the site, bypassing the normal steps via the browser, etc., mentioned above. Neat -huh? I have shortcuts on my screen for the ARRL member page, Eqsl, OB club newsletter page, QRZ Call Lookup site, HCARC Web page site, US weather forecast site, plus others. One double-click on these and I am looking at the page of the Web page of interest!

So, how do you go about doing this. It is easy, but there a few steps to go through.

- 1. With your Favorites list open, select one site you want to make into a shortcut.
- 2. Right click on it. A menu opens with various choices, select Send To>. Click it.
- 3. That opens a menu with the choices of destinations. Click on Desktop.
- 4. You will then find the new shortcut in the left lower corner of the Desktop. You can drag it to any place you wish on the Desktop. I group all these Web shortcuts together in one area of the screen. You just have to double-click on any of them and you are right into the site, just like that!

I hope this proves as useful to you as it has been for me.
